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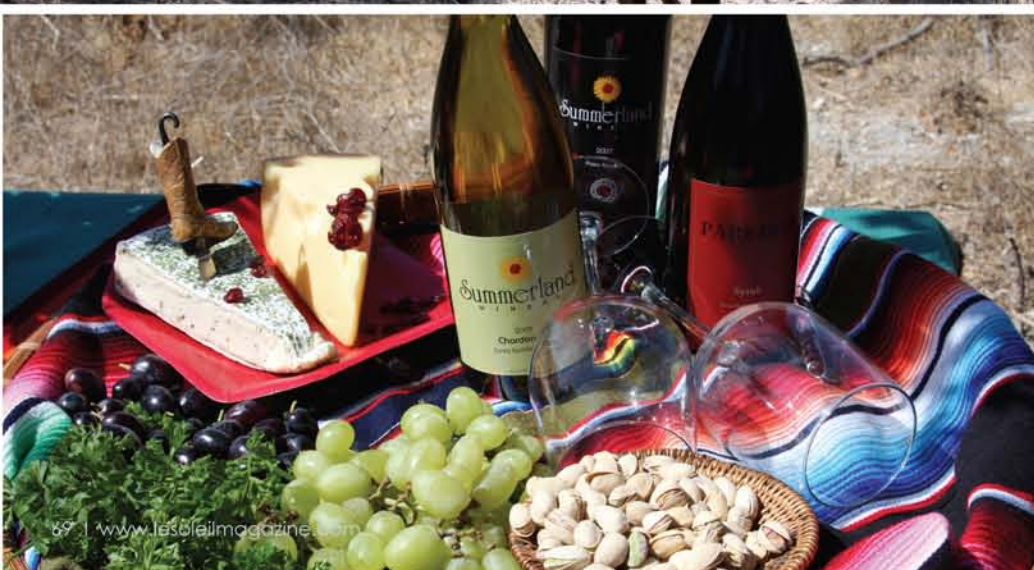

With horses, mules and good food, clients get a taste of what it once was in early California.

Graham Goodfield was a packer and hunting guide in Montana and Idaho. A 6th generation Santa Barbara native whose family grows avocados, now the owner/operator of Los Padres Outfitters, specializing in fully catered pack trip adventures in the Los Padres National Forest.

"Through outfitting I find it most rewarding to be able to show people the back country and let them discover what they're missing," says Goodfield. "I want my clients to have a great experience that is safe and most of all fun." He provides that experience with such ease, which can only come from loving what you do.

From horse-drawn wagon trips through the Los Padres National Forest, to fully-catered horse and mule pack trips, beach, trail and

wine/cheese rides, Goodfield customizes the adventure to suit the group. He takes painting and photography groups, where he will pack in to an area, then drop off clients with their easels or cameras so that they can enjoy a peaceful day of painting or photographing the countryside, while camp is being set up for them and food is prepared for their return. He does this every day because he truly enjoys it.

An experienced camp cook, a typical meal could be Cedar Plank Salmon, Tri-tip Barbecue, Prosciutto Wrapped Prawns, or fresh Pacific Lobster with a bottle of local wine. "I packed live lobsters for a group. We were camping in the snow and turned all of the lobsters loose. They started crawling around in the snow and the group got to pick their own meal," says Goodfield. He also makes Dutch Oven rattlesnake hors d'oeuvres and fresh ice cream.



His quarter horses browse on hundreds of acres of grass pastures on Rincon Mountain overlooking the famous Rincon Point. He also breaks and trains horses, including thoroughbreds for polo players. His family's ranch, "Ivy Oaks," has a 100-year old barn, and a Craftsman house that was built in 1909. Goodfield recently married at the Historic Santa Barbara Mission in July.
